A MESSAGE FROM Father Manny

DEAR PARISHIONERS AND FRIENDS OF SAINT MARY OF THE LAKE AND OUR LADY OF LOURDES,

After several parish information sessions for all parishioners regarding the future of Our Lady of Lourdes Church on December 3, 2023, the Parish Discernment Team met on December 9, 2023 to determine the best path forward. After much prayer, serious discernment and thoughtful dialogue, the Parish Discernment Team made the recommendation to the Multisite Review Team to end regular Sunday worship at the Our Lady of Lourdes Church on May 19, 2024. We have received word that this recommendation has been accepted by the Archdiocesan Multisite Review Senior Leadership team and will be reviewed by the Archdiocesan Presbyteral Council in March 2024. This is a very difficult moment in the life of our parish. We understand that this decision will cause hurt, sadness, anger and confusion. I ask that we hold in prayer all the current and former parishioners of Our Lady of Lourdes Church who will be affected by the

As your Pastor, it is my responsibility to look after the spiritual well-being of all parishioners who worship at both sites. This responsibility does not end when a site closes. I have asked the Parish Discernment Team to come up with ways we can help those who currently worship at the Our Lady of Lourdes Church to remain connected to the Church beyond May 19. Some ideas

closure.





beginning to emerge include adding a few more masses at the Saint Mary of the Lake Site and getting a church van to pick up seniors on Sunday at their homes to bring them to Mass. How these suggestions will be acted upon has yet to be determined.

While I would hope to have all current parishioners who worship at Our Lady of Lourdes join parishioners at the Saint Mary of the Lake site, I know that this is not realistic for some. Our staff will work with every family to identify the best way to stay connected to the life of the Church even if it is not at Saint Mary's. We will also be open to meeting and praying with people individually who will be affected by this loss. While this moment of pain and disappointment is challenging, I invite you to join me in living this pain and disappointment together. I want to listen to you, walk with you, and discern together how the Mission of Our Lady of Lourdes Church can continue.

The life of a disciple and the mission that Jesus entrusted to His Church cannot end when a church building closes. While the days ahead will be difficult; we must do all we can to make sure we remain connected so that the Gospel of Jesus can continue to be preached and lived out in Ravenswood, Buena Park and Uptown. His mission of love, service and forgiveness must go on.

Let us stay close in faith and prayer as we walk this journey together.

A PASTORAL Reflection

THE SEASON OF LENT

Sr. Claudia Sanchez, FCJ, Faith Formation and Hispanic Ministry

WHO IS SISTER CLAUDIA?

I am Sister Claudia Sánchez, a religious sister of the Familia Corde Jesu religious congregation. I arrived at Saint Mary of the Lake and Our Lady of Lourdes, two and a half years ago, and I am at the service of the community in the coordination of the Faith Formation Program (programs in Spanish), from children's catechesis, to adult catechesis and the RCIA program (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults), and I lend a hand with the choirs in Spanish.

I would like to share with you that the time I have served among you has been a blessing for me. I can say that what I like most about my apostolate is seeing how God touches the heart of each person, and it is a reason for great joy. see how people are giving a concrete and simple response to the Lord. Seeing them participate with enthusiasm in Sunday masses, forming a community, hearing with deep joy that they came to confess after many years, seeing them receive our Lord in the Eucharist, knowing that approaching the Lord is opening their hearts so that He may transform from within, on a path of conversion.



This February 14 we are celebrating Ash Wednesday, with which the season of Lent opens, a time that strongly invites us to conversion, to change our lives because we feel loved and called to resemble Jesus, to imitate him.

This season of Lent invites us to contemplate more closely the infinite love of God for us, who has loved us so much to the point of giving us his own Son, Jesus Christ, who suffered, died and rose again for our salvation. The question may arise: what should I do to be able to follow Jesus? How can I accept his salvation in my life? Above all, it is accepting him in our lives, wanting to follow him and learning to listen to his voice. The Church at this time offers us practices that are fundamental in life: Prayer, fasting and charity. This is a good time to stop and pray, to meditate on the Word of God, especially the Gospels, prayer is what keeps us vitally united to the Lord, it is to dialogue with Him and let him speak into our lives. Let us not forget that the liturgical prayer par excellence is the Holy Mass, let us participate in it in an active, attentive and loving way.

Fasting, which is a very healthy practice, many times we have the false idea that fasting is only intended to mortify the senses, and that is not the case, fasting invites us to be in a vigilant attitude, it helps us not to think only of ourselves, but to see the need of those who are more in need than us, and drives us to offer our sacrifice for those who could benefit from it, the true meaning of fasting is closely linked to charity, II am mortified not to eat as I usually do, but not only that, that food, those goods that I usually invest in, should not remain saved, they have to be shared, I deprive myself of something that I like and that does me good, to share it with that one. person who has greater need, so our fasting has a much greater value, because it is not only a practice of spiritual mortification, between God and me,



between God and my family, but for the love of God, my heart is capable of being open to the needs of my brothers and sisters, and I give them not of what I have left, but of what I have for my own sustenance. I hope that this time of Lent that the Church proposes to us, will be for us a time of grace, a time of conversion towards the Lord who, loving us to the extreme, worked hard for our Salvation, so that by surrendering to the Lord we can open our hearts, our homes, our efforts to our brothers and sisters.

SOUP KITCHEN & SACK MEAL PROGRAM

Volunteers are needed to <u>MAKE SACK MEALS</u> and to help with service on Wednesday nights. To make this a success consistently each week, we need **80 individuals/families** to commit to donating at least once a month.

Each sack meal should contain:

- •2 lunch meat sandwiches with no condiments, cheese is optional but a nice addition
- •2 cheese sticks
- •1 bag of chips (or similar)
- •1 piece of soft fruit (for example, orange, banana, grapes)
- Dessert (cookies or candy bar)
- •Beverage (juice box, can of soda, or 8 oz water bottle/sports drink)
- Napkin

Please pack each meal in a gallon-sized plastic bag (like Ziploc). Or please use a plastic grocery bag.


