A MESSAGE FROM Father Wince

CATHOLICS AND THE BIBLE

"Why don't Catholics read the Bible?" This is a question I have heard, and perhaps you have as well, especially from some of our fundamentalist Protestant neighbors.

I usually answer that question in a couple of ways. One of the first things I can say (and you can as well, if asked), is that Catholics may not read the Bible all that much, but they certainly hear a great deal of the Bible. Our Sunday Readings follow a three-year cycle and the Readings at our weekday liturgies follow a two-year cycle. If someone attends Mass every day for three years, that individual will hear a rather significant portion of the sacred books.

Secondly, most of our Protestant friends believe that the Bible is the only source of divine revelation. In fact, "Scripture alone" (sola Scriptura – in Latin) was one of the battle cries of the sixteenth century Protestant Reformation and has remained a significant doctrine in most Protestant traditions even to this day. We Catholics believe that the ongoing living Tradition of the Church, like the Bible, is also a gift from God. Tradition (with a capital "T") assists us in unpacking and understanding all that God has revealed. We believe that Scripture and Tradition are like two fountains nourished from the same divine stream. We likewise have a concern that studying the Bible, without the assistance of the Church's Tradition, could easily lead someone into theological error. This is one of the major reasons we Catholics were slow to encourage our members to read the Bible on their own.

Although we maintain the Bible is important, I think it is also important to recall that the Church existed before many of these books were defined as divinely inspired. The Church decided what books were included in the Bible and which ones were not. Several other important religious books, of both Jewish and Christian origin, were very significant for quite some time and may have been considered to be divinely inspired in some circles (like the III and IV Maccabees or Protoevangelium of James), but they did not "make the cut" and were not considered part of the Catholic Scriptures.

Finally, I believe we should recall that God's ultimate revelation is not a book, or a series of books, it is a person – Jesus of Nazareth. Important as the Scriptures are, it is Jesus who is the jewel in the crown of God's plan of self-revelation.



I want to say a few words about how to go about studying the Bible. Some folks believe that anyone can pick up the Sacred Scriptures and should be able to determine their meaning. In some regards I think this is true. For example, I suspect almost anyone can understand the implications of the Good Samaritan parable.

However, I would like to make the case that understanding the Bible is a very complicated enterprise. The books which became the Bible were composed by a number of writers over a period of at least a thousand years. Although inspired by the Holy Spirit, each author wrote from their own personal perspective, and each was influenced and limited by their own time and culture. This is why I think anyone wishing to study the Bible, which is a noble enterprise, should do so with a little help. Sometimes someone will ask me which is the best version of the Bible they should purchase. I usually suggest The Catholic Bible – Personal Study Edition. The translation which is used is the New American Bible, but the Personal Study Edition has hundreds of pages of commentary from highly regarded scholars which will be most helpful for the neophyte's understanding of the Sacred Scriptures which are so important to us.

St. Jerome is considered to be the one who coined the phrase "Ignorance of the Scripture is ignorance of Christ." He was right. If you wish to study the Bible, go to it, but please make certain you have some guidance along the way.

DISCIPLE MAKER INDEX SURVEY RESULTS

Last year (Lent 2023), our parish participated in a 75-question survey administered by the Catholic Leadership Institute. We received a tremendous amount of data! This report provides some highlights of our strengths as a parish, as well as opportunities for growth. The Survey Committee is committed to working with our Parish Staff and Leadership Councils as we seek to form disciples who serve the needs of our parish and the wider community. STRENGTHS

Several areas rose to the top of the survey for our parish in the areas of Leadership, a strong belief in foundational Catholic teachings, the Sunday experience, the engagement of the Latino community, and individual Spiritual Practices.

Community Engagement for Latino Community:

Across many survey questions, we noticed stronger scores among the Latino community. We are grateful for our bi-lingual priests, sisters, and staff, and the strength of lay-leadership among our Spanish speaking community. This was especially noticeable in areas such as:

- I feel welcomed and accepted 91% (2 points higher than parish average)
- Recommend staff 86% (10 points higher than parish average)
- Recommend other priests 87% (2 points higher than parish average)
- Follow-up on involvement 80% (16 points higher than parish average)
- My parish supports me in times of need 79% (11 points higher than parish average)

Enthusiasm for the Spiritual Journey:

Overall, our parishioners report great enthusiasm for the spiritual journey. We received strong responses in categories that asked about the individual faith journey – such as how our parish helps them grow spiritually, whether the Church is critical to their relationship with God, and how our parish is forming them as a disciple – and yet, we still have room to grow in all of these areas. The following chart show frequency of mass attendance, personal prayer, and pace of spiritual growth:

OPPORTUNITIES

Over the past several months, the Survey Committee and Parish staff have been meeting to analyze the survey results and develop recommendations. We are especially interested in identifying areas where we can make a concerted effort that will have a substantial and lasting impact on people's spiritual growth and engagement with the church. Below are our initial recommendations:

Recommendation #1 - Become a Welcoming & Inviting Community:

Recognizing that nearly half of our parishioners have been attending SML/OLL for less than 5 years, we need to be intentional about welcoming people, helping newcomers find information, and connecting people with ways to get involved with our ministries and community. The Parish Council is already exploring ideas such as a Welcome Kit, a New Parishioner Dinner, and website updates.

Recommendation #2 - Invest in Initiatives that Promote Spiritual Formation:

We know there is fertile soil to help people develop as disciples, with over half of respondents already growing or desiring to grow more in their faith. We are considering additional opportunities for retreats, speaker series, formation for liturgical ministers, and faith sharing groups. Examples include the recent information sessions for Eucharistic ministers and the upcoming Lenten Parish Mission!

Recommendation #3 - Follow-up on Parishioners' Interest in Getting Involved:

A significant area of improvement is the need for follow-up when parishioners express interest in getting involved with our parish. This was noted in both the survey results and through anecdotal stories shared among the Survey Committee, and it was a consistent need across all demographic groups.


