### A MESSAGE FROM Father Erick



### TRADITION, MAGISTERIUM AND REVELATION

Dear fellow parishioners of this Saint Mary of the Lake and Our Lady of Lourdes, once again I am pleased to address you with joy. In the last reflection I wrote to you about the Love of the Trinity and the loving action that was made in all creation including man and that it was not enough that man had been lost but saved in Jesus.

All this beautiful doctrinal reflection is found in the Bible, but beyond it we will also find the reflective contributions in the Tradition and Magisterium of the Church throughout the XXI centuries of History. But, what is this Tradition, Magisterium and Revelation? The word tradition comes from the Greek paradosis, in the ecclesiastical sense, which is the only one in which it is used here, sometimes it refers to the doctrine, narration or custom transmitted from one generation to the next.

This Tradition has two ways: The oral and the written. At that time, the oral tradition was the traditional and popular means of collecting and transmitting the facts and sayings of a character to others. Orally, the disciples, direct witnesses of Jesus the Nazarene, transmitted his sayings and deeds to the other Christians of the primitive community, which they later collected in writing, calling them the Gospels. The oral tradition was by word of mouth, because there were no necessary elements to write until the way of writing events was discovered so that nothing of what was seen and said was not erased. There is writing on papyrus, sand, stone, animal skins until ink and paper emerged. More broadly with Johannes Gutenberg in 1450 with the first printing of the Bible on paper.

And what is the Magisterium? The magisterium is the care of the deposit of faith so that it is not contaminated by some doctrinal error, since the doctrine must be cared for and kept intact as Jesus wanted it. Hence, the doctrine did not change, does not change, nor will it change. The church hierarchically represented by the pope and the bishops in communion with him must guard the deposit of faith. The Church in assemblies, in councils, or through other instances can make decisions regarding discipline, but never in doctrine.

The word Magisterium derives from the mission of the Church to be a Teacher of men. The Church is in charge of protecting the entire People of God from deviations and failures, and of guaranteeing an error-free profession of the authentic faith. The office of the Magisterium is aimed at ensuring that the People of God remain in the Truth. To fulfill this service, Christ has given pastors the charism of infallibility in matters of faith and customs. This means that, due to the special help they have from the Holy Spirit, the Pope and the bishops in communion with him cannot make mistakes when they say something about faith or morals.

And finally we come to the revelation. The revelation is preceded by the Tradition and the Magisterium, but not for that reason it stops being less important or becomes more important. None of the three is more or less. All three are linked together and one serves the other. Thus it is marked that the Revelation that is the word of God or the Bible itself uses these other ways to better understand what God wants from men. As Christians we cannot desert alone or try to interpret the Bible alone, it is the Magisterium who has the authority to interpret and tell us what God wants to tell us through the Bible. Thus it is manifested that the Bible is not the only way to know the designs of God.

There are also many other things that Jesus did, which, if they were written in detail, I think even the world itself could not contain the books that would be written. -John 21:25.

## STRENGTHS & GIFTS for the Journey

### INTRODUCING THE "STRENGTHS AND GIFTS FOR THE **JOURNEY" PROGRAM**

This four-week program allows an in-depth exploration of the strengths that participants can grow from their God-given talents, the spiritual gifts that reflect those strengths, and how they can call upon their strengths and gifts to become disciples of Christ. Open to all adult parishioners, the program is based on Gallup's StrengthsFinder 1.0 Assessment <sup>™</sup> and the book *Living Your Strengths (Catholic Edition)*, as well as an established online spiritual gifts assessment program.

Participants will take an assessment tool developed by Gallup, Inc. that will identify and explore their God-given talents, strategies for developing their talents into strengths, and ways in which their top strengths can work together on an individual and group basis. Participants will also take an established on-line assessment that allows them to discover their spiritual gifts. Together these assessments will be used to explore how each participant can draw upon his or her God-given talents, strengths and spiritual gifts to become a disciple of Christ.

The Strengths and Gifts for the Journey program will be conducted in four small group sessions lasting approximately 2 hours each. Each session will involve prayer, reflection about relevant passages from Scripture, and active sharing of each participant's strengths and spiritual gifts assessment results. Led by trained facilitators, the small group discussions will be focused on how participants can utilize their strengths and spiritual gifts to enrich their faith life and improve their effectiveness in daily life. At the conclusion of the program, participants will be asked to make a specific commitment to use their God-given talents, strengths and spiritual gifts at Saint Mary's and Our Lady of Lourdes or elsewhere on their journey to become disciples of Christ.

The summer/inaugural program is limited to 40 participants only. Each participant is asked to do the following:

- 1. Register by July 16, 2023 online at <a href="https://www.saintmarys.org/strengths">www.saintmarys.org/strengths</a>.
- 2. Contribute a \$20 donation which helps to cover costs of the book and all program materials.
- 3. Pick up your book: Living Your Strengths: Discover Your God-Given Talents and Inspire Your Community in the parish office, which also contains a unique code for you to take a pre-workshop assessment and access to other resources for our discussions.
- 4. Complete the 45 minute assessment and submit results no later than July 20th to prepared for your first session. See the website for details.
- 5. Plan to join others on Monday nights, beginning July 24th!





### **SOUP KITCHEN & SACK MEAL PROGRAM**

Volunteers are needed to **MAKE SACK MEALS** and to help with service on Wednesday nights. To make this a success consistently each week, we need 80 individuals/families to commit to donating at least once a month.

#### Each sack meal should contain:

- 2 lunch meat sandwiches with no condiments, cheese is optional but a nice addition
- 2 cheese sticks
- 1 bag of chips (or similar)
- 1 piece of soft fruit (for example, orange, banana, grapes)
- Dessert (cookies or candy bar)
- Beverage (juice box, can of soda, or 8 oz water bottle/sports drink)
- Napkin

Please pack each meal in a gallon-sized plastic bag (like Ziploc). Or please use a plastic grocery bag.

## GROWING IN FAITH Together

### A Prophet's Reward

"Move back in with us until you save enough for a decent house," my mother told me over and over again as the birth of my second child neared.

My little family was quickly outgrowing our rented space, but the housing market in our area was a nightmare for first-time homebuyers. As appealing as the offer was, I kept refusing, convinced that my mother didn't understand the chaos, disruption, and loss of personal space that such a move would mean for her and my dad.

I was wrong — she did. And eventually she wore me down. When my son was three months old my family of four moved back into my old bedroom. My parents made an office space for my husband in the basement, and they converted their den into a playroom for two of the loudest children you will ever meet. They told us we could stay as long as we needed to (it ended up being two years). They greeted us with love and warmth every morning and never made us feel like we were an inconvenience.

Today's first reading always reminds me of my mom, not because I consider myself a prophet (hardly) but because of the way she received me specifically, in whose name she received me.

I've always tried to understand exactly what makes my parents' acts of love — toward me, toward each other, toward perfect strangers — feel so genuine. I think, after more than 30 years, I've finally realized the secret: my parents love God more than they love me. They love God more than they love anyone.

Like making room in their life and their home for me and my boisterous family, these acts originate in sacrifice. They don't come cheap. They come from the cross.

### Why do we do that? **Catholic Life Explained**

### Question:

Is the Catholic Mass really celebrated the same throughout the whole world?

### **Answer:**

One of the truisms of the Catholic Faith is that "wherever you go in the world, the Mass is the same." In fact, the answer to this question is both "yes" and "no."

On the one hand, the essential elements of the Roman Rite are the same. The structure of the Mass as it is presented in the Roman Missal is consistent and this is one of the beauties of belonging to a liturgical tradition.

On the other hand, however, there are elements of celebrations that can vary depending on the country or even local region you might be in. For example, in certain parts of the world, certain feasts and solemnities are celebrated on different days (even here in the United States the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord can be celebrated on Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter or it may take the place of the Seventh Sunday of Easter, depending on what diocese you are in). Whether it is the use of certain liturgical colors, local celebrations of regional saints, special seasonal blessings of crops or produce, or the use of dance and processions all demonstrate a sort of organic variety that can exist even within our established liturgical tradition. While we always respect what is essential to the rite, such local variations and traditions are very much in keeping with the vision of liturgical renewal and adaption envisioned by the Second Vatican Council's Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (nos. 37-40).




