

A MESSAGE FROM OUR *Pastor*

DEAR PARISHIONERS AND FRIENDS OF SAINT MARY'S,

For many centuries, the Church has considered the month of May as a special time in which we are invited to celebrate and honor Mary, the Mother of God. The Blessed Mother is central to the history of Salvation. Her willingness to accept the Mission God entrusted to her at an early age, continues to inspire us to be more like her and to do what her son tells us.

That moment at the foot of the cross, a few minutes before his death, Jesus is concerned about who will care for his mother. He said to her, 'Woman, here is your son,' and to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.' From that time on, this disciple took her into his home. The unnamed disciple whom Jesus addressed was John, and some Church Fathers see John as standing for the Church. Jesus entrusts the care of His Mother to us.

During the Month of May, Catholics throughout the world show their care and love for Jesus's mother. But how did May become the month of Mary?

The custom has its roots in Ancient Greece and Ancient Rome. The Greeks dedicated the month of May to Artemis, the goddess of chastity and childbirth. The Romans dedicated May to Flora, the goddess of blooms or blossoms. At the end of April, they celebrated laudi florals, or floral games and asked their goddess for all that blooms. In the Middle Ages, similar customs took

place, all focused on saying good-bye to winter while May was considered the month where new growth would start.

During the Middle Ages, the tradition of Tricesimum, or "Thirty-Day Devotion to Mary," was born. The month-long celebration known as "Lady Month," was held from August 15-September 14 but the idea of a month dedicated to honoring Mary in May developed in the early 17th Century. It was then that Mary's Month and May were combined, making May the Month of Mary. As our church honors in its title the Blessed Virgin Mary; Saint Mary of the Lake (Michigan) and since we will be joining another Church with a Marian title; Our Lady of Lourdes; I invite you to join me as we pray the Rosary together during the Month of May. Let us ask Mary, Mother of God and our Mother, to intercede for our church communities. That we may not be paralyzed by fear as we face the future together. That as we come together, we may remain focused on the Mission Her son entrusted to us: to love God above all and our neighbor as ourselves.

REFLECTION FROM CONNOR FORD,

THREEFOLD JUDGEMENT

It's a cold January 17, 2021, you wake up a few minutes late and end up missing your mass reservation. You quickly drive through neighborhoods looking for a parish to accept "walk in" participation for mass. You are warmly welcomed into this parish, but as the opening song *One Bread, One Body* begins. You stand and think to yourself – wait this song is oddly placed in the mass. As your wheels start to turn you ask yourself, "How does the music director choose the music for mass anyway?" Unable to focus during mass, you continue to ponder the process.

Now, that the theoretical situation is set let's take a step back to the particular mass you were attending. It was the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, and most parishes would be celebrating the Rite of Acceptance. The theme of the readings is "What are you looking for?" The majority of music directors within the Catholic church will use a three-pillar judgment system to determine where, when, and if a song should be used in the context of a particular liturgy. Those three pillars include: liturgical, musical, and pastoral. While it may seem simple, a lot of time and effort go into debating and choosing appropriate music for mass.

Let's walk through this situation together. Given the context, the song is "*One Bread, One Body*" it's the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, and it has been chosen as the opening song. The first "test" is liturgical. In other words, does this selection meet what the mass readings are about – textual, and is it appropriate for its current place – structural. For some background the opening hymn should foster a sense of unity, open the celebration, set the "scene" for the celebration, and accompany the priest and ministers to the front of the church. This song would fail the first test under structural component. The text throughout the piece resounds with the structural rite of communion.

Let's take a look at the second judgement, musical. This judgment evaluates whether or not the music is technically, aesthetically, and expressively worthy. In other words, the select doesn't detract and over time the pieces don't cheapen the liturgy. "*One Bread, One Body*" is a well written piece that is accessible to parishioners with little to no musical training and has



become a song that the majority of the church knows. This piece would meet this particular test of the three fold judgment. Lastly, the pastoral judgement takes into consideration the bringing of people closer to God through the means of music. As stated before, this piece is well known and accessible to the majority

of the faithful to sing. It is one of the pieces that can engage full and active participation within the context of mass because it has withstood the true test of time. The piece works for people to sing to, but allows for the grace of playing meditatively which also fosters people's personal prayer. This piece also meets the pastoral judgment.

You now might be thinking, "Well the song meets two of the three tests – it's a good fit!" I would urge you to not apply a numerical count when selecting music for the liturgy. At the end of the day, the piece must be a good fit for what is happening at that current structural moment in the mass. "*One Bread, One Body*" is a perfect fit for the communion song.

SAINT MARY'S VENEZUELAN RELIEF FUND

"For I was a stranger, and you welcomed me" -Matthew 25

On Monday, April 19th, the Venezuelan Ambassador to the United States Carlos Vecchio visited Saint Mary of the Lake to meet with the Venezuelan Community of Chicago.



That night he shared the recent opportunity created under US immigration law that gives Venezuelan refugees the opportunity to have Temporary Protected Status (TPS). However, the window of opportunity to apply for such protection expires on September 5th, 2021.

At Saint Mary's we have 25 Venezuelan parishioners who qualify for such protection but need help in covering the legal fees associated with the filing (\$750 for the attorney and \$545 for the application fee).





There is no secret that this past year we were presented with so many challenges and changes to our daily lives due to the COVID-19 pandemic. However along with those challenges were many opportunities for newness, adaptation and most importantly moving forward together. While schools had to quickly shift to virtual teaching and learning, the same challenge was presented to parish religious education programs. This past fall we successfully began the 2020-2021 catechetical year with 38 children and teens in the Saint Mary of the Lake Religious Education Program. Guiding these young people were 9 adults and 1 high school student who responded to the call of being a catechist, to teach and pass on the faith.
