A MESSAGE FROM *Father Vince*

“LORD, TEACH US TO PRAY AS JOHN TAUGHT HIS DISCIPLES (LUKE 11: 1).”

Prayer. I think praying is, paradoxically, one of the easiest and most difficult things many of us do. Sometimes we have no trouble finding the words we want to address to God, and sometimes we stumble or go mute in frustration when attempting to do so. I know of people who are searching for God, or who are returning to God and to the faith, who get stuck at the issue of not knowing how to pray. I also have had conversations with people who were raised in the Church and attend Mass regularly, but still find it a challenge to know how to talk to God in a personal way. I make no claim to be an expert on the topic of prayer, but I would like to make a couple of suggestions which may be helpful.

I want to begin by speaking about personal prayer. From what I understand there is a consensus among spiritual leaders which crosses denominational lines claiming that the first rule of prayer is simply to show up. God is waiting to hear from us, regardless of how articulate we are. God cares about his children and wants to hear from us. After all, parents are happy to hear from their kids who are in college, even if it is just a request for more money. God is waiting for us to show up. It is fine with him if we are not able to communicate with him very well.

Secondly, prayer involves some sort of discipline. No relationship grows unless both parties make it a point to intentionally connect with one another. Getting around to God when we have the time (which could be several days or even longer) does not foster a relationship with him. If people ask me about how to pray, I frequently suggest that they pray as they can rather than pray as they cannot. Over the years I have heard people tell me that one of the best times for them to pray is before going to sleep. I think that is a good idea, especially if it involves inviting God to review the day along with us. Other people have told me they like to start the day with a quick “thank you” to God and then make a pledge to dedicate the day to him. Some folks tell me they get up early, make a cup of coffee, and simply sit in quiet with the Lord. There are any numbers of ways to pray, but we need to be intentional in terms of time dedicated to being with God.

In my own prayer I have discovered the importance of using other people’s words to express what I want to say to God. I have recently retrieved the “Morning Offering” and made it part of my daily prayer. I often use two prayers which have been attributed to St. Ignatius Loyola – the “Prayer for Generosity” and the “Suscipe.” All three of these prayers are accessible online. My mother prayed a Rosary virtually every day during her declining years. One of the advantages of his traditional form of prayer is it has a beginning, middle, and end. The Rosary also invites us to remember important events in the lives of Jesus and Mary. If you would like some assistance in praying the Rosary the “Broken Mary” app is a good place to turn.

Occasionally, especially when I am on retreat, I write to God about what’s going on in my heart and my soul. This is called journaling. Sometimes the content of what I write is rather brief and superficial, but I am writing about



where I happen to be on a given day. As I indicated I do not use this form of prayer very often. However, I have heard others mention that journaling is helpful because it requires the writing of specific words when speaking to God.

I want to conclude by mentioning that there is a difference between private prayer, public prayer, and ritual prayer– like the Sacraments. When it comes to private prayer, we can pray pretty much in any manner we choose, for as long as we choose, using whatever words we wish to use or using no words at all. However, praying with other people, especially when praying publicly, demands a bit more structure simply because other people are involved. There needs to be an understanding regarding who will pray and sometimes even the prayer which will be said. Think of sessions of Congress when a chaplain begins the gathering with a prayer or consider grace before a family meal. Because other people are involved my private prayer takes a backseat to what we are doing together.

When it comes to ritual prayer, things change even more. When we partake in a sacred ritual, like Mass or another Sacrament, we are asked to submit to something that is bigger than we are. This notion flies in the face of a culturally accepted norm that prayer, like so many things, must always be relevant to me and my tastes. When it comes to sacred rituals we bow before that which has been handed down to us, and we give ourselves to it.

If we want to be disciples of Jesus, we need to be people of prayer. There are a variety of ways to pray – personally, collectively, and ritually. All three ways of praying are necessary if we choose to walk in the ways of Jesus in our Catholic tradition.

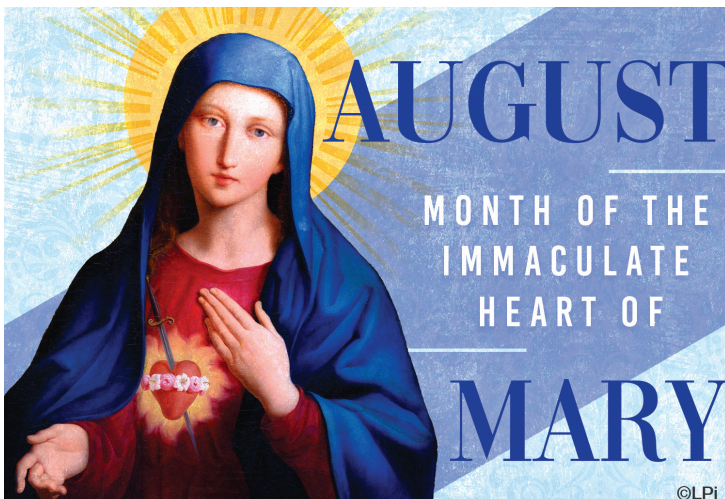

SOUP KITCHEN & SACK MEAL PROGRAM

Volunteers are needed to **MAKE SACK MEALS** and to help with service on Wednesday nights. To make this a success consistently each week, we need **80 individuals/families** to commit to donating at least once a month.

Each sack meal should contain:

- 2 lunch meat sandwiches with no condiments, cheese is optional but a nice addition
- 2 cheese sticks
- 1 bag of chips (or similar)
- 1 piece of soft fruit (for example, orange, banana, grapes)
- Dessert (cookies or candy bar)
- Beverage (juice box, can of soda, or 8 oz water bottle/sports drink)
- Napkin

Please pack each meal in a gallon-sized plastic bag (like Ziploc). Or please use a plastic grocery bag.

Wednesday between 9:00 a.m. and 6:00pm, drop off at the parish reception desk, as they will be handed out beginning at 6:00pm.

ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

On August 15, our Church celebrates the solemn feast of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary into heaven. In the year 1950, Pope Pius XII solemnly proclaimed the dogma of the Assumption of Mary. This is a universal belief of the Church from the first centuries to the present day. The essential element of this dogma teaches that the Virgin Mary, at the end of her life in this world, was taken to heaven body and soul.

Pope Paul VI wrote: "Our aspiration to eternal life seems to take wings and soar to marvelous heights, reflecting that our Heavenly Mother is up there, she sees us and contemplates us with her gaze full of tenderness." (Speech 15-VIII 1963)

The Second Vatican Council expresses itself in a similar way when it says: "The Mother of Jesus, in the same way that, already glorified in heaven in body and soul, is the image and principle of the Church that was to have its fulfillment in the life future, so on earth it precedes with its light the pilgrim People of God as a sign of certain hope and consolation until the day of the Lord arrives". (Const. Dogm. Lumen gentium, n.68; cf. Sacrosanctum Concilium, n.103)

We all rejoice in the words of the Psalmist: "You are glad, in your palace the sound of the harp. Daughters of kings are your beloved, a queen sits at your right, Ophir's gold shines on her garments. The king's daughter dressed in brocades, to the royal chamber she is led." (Ps 45:10,15)

We rejoice because Mary, the Mother of Our Saviour, is taken to heaven in body and soul. She, who lived so united to her Son here on earth, is now taken to heaven to be with her Son for all eternity. What comfort to know that in heaven there are two human hearts that beat for us! The heart of Jesus and that of Mary.

This feast also offers us a lot of hope. It reveals to us the goodness and benevolence of God the Father. The virtues of Mary, her goodness and her beauty have been rewarded with glory. She is a sign of hope for us. If she has been rewarded for her fidelity, we will also be rewarded for our fidelity.

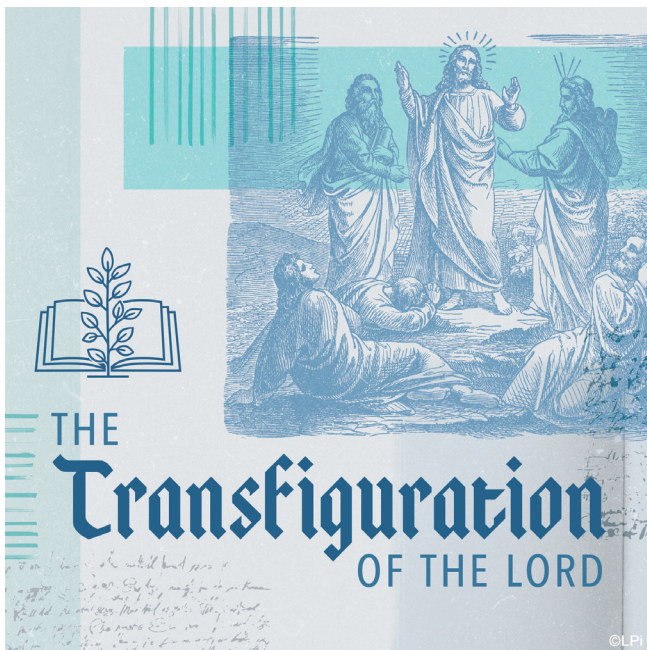
NAVIGATING DIVORCE MINISTRY
